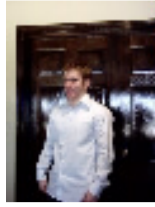

## Students of the Month for February 2006

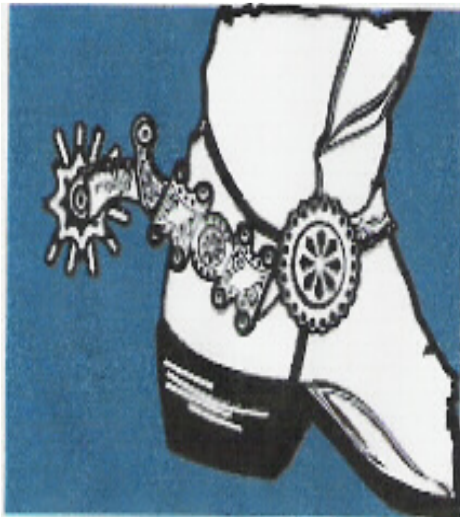
